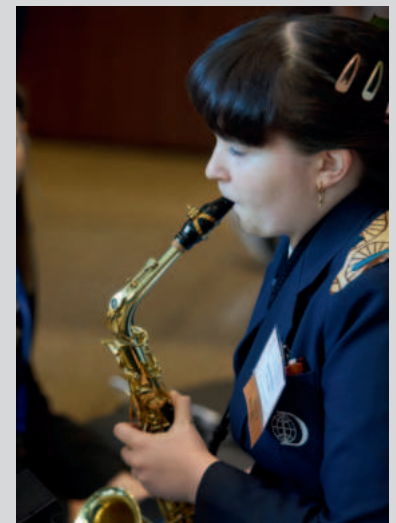
### TIGRE ACHIEVERS
